Hello Program Office Partners,

As you have likely heard, the Administration has cancelled all HUD funding, including all TA Awards with the eight TA providers listed below. The background, a sample letter, and the firms can also be found below. Included with this email is a report detailing the impacted awards by provider, for your reference. This follows last week's closure of supplemental TA appropriations for CARES, ARP, GRRP, and NSP program TA as well.

As program offices that direct TA work, please know that the providers are expected to work with you to conclude work, share draft/final deliverables, and complete their final closeout activities. They should cease all substantive work but are authorized to work on closing out the cooperative agreements in the coming 90-120 days (depending on the date of their award). You do not need to take any actions unless our GTRs ask you to review something in DRGR as part of the closeout process. You may respond to the providers and engage them for final status/deliverable transfer. You are also authorized to reassign the work under way to other TA providers, as appropriate.

We are sure you have more questions, but this is all we can say for now.
